## HUMAN TRAFFICKING IS HAPPENING NOW IN COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE COUNTRY.

Recognize the signs. The person may be:

- Forced/coerced to perform commercial sex acts or is under the age
  of 18 and engaged in commercial sex
- · Unable to leave their job or situation without severe consequences
- · Forced to provide services to work off a debt
- · Controlled, watched, coached, or threatened by someone
- · Not in possession or control of their own money or identification
- · Inappropriately dressed, malnourished, disengaged, or tired

While no single indicator is proof of human trafficking, these are a few that should alert you to a potential trafficking situation.
