### CONNECT WITH YOUR FUSION CENTER

[Fusion Centers](#) are state and local-owned and operated centers that serve as focal points in states and major urban areas for the receipt, analysis, gathering, and sharing of threat-related information between state, local, tribal, territorial, and campus (SLTTC), federal, and private sector partners.

The National Network of Fusion Centers (National Network) brings critical context and value to Homeland Security and law enforcement that no other federal or local organization can replicate. Fusion Centers accomplish this through sharing information, providing partners with a unique perspective on threats, and being the primary contact between frontline personnel, state and local leadership and the rest of the Homeland Security Enterprise. ### ATTEND I&A BRIEFINGS

The DHS Office of Intelligence & Analysis (I&A) is the only Intelligence Community element statutorily charged with delivering intelligence to SLTTC and private sector partners and developing intelligence from those partners.

## JOIN HSIN

The Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) is DHS' official system for trusted sharing of information between federal, state, local, tribal, territorial, and private stakeholders. HSIN provides law enforcement with a central location for valuable intelligence resources, situational awareness, and virtual collaboration and meeting rooms. **To create an account and get connected to relevant communities and tools, contact [hsin@hq.dhs.gov](mailto:hsin@hq.dhs.gov).**

**HSIN Intelligence (HSIN-Intel):** Sworn law enforcement partners, fusion centers, and other domestic intelligence partners use HSIN-Intel to access up-to-date intelligence products from the National Network of Fusion Centers and federal partners. Through HSIN-Intel, sworn law enforcement officers can:

- Access “For Official Use Only” (FOUO) and “Law Enforcement Sensitive” (LES) information, data products, intelligence resources and tools, shared by fusion center analysts and intelligence professionals.
- Gain 24/7 situational awareness tools to ensure awareness and coordination during regional and national level incidents.

**HSIN Critical Infrastructure (HSIN-CI):** Provides situational awareness, collaboration, and critical and timely infrastructure protection information and resources. Through HSIN-CI members can:

- Access real-time document sharing and collaboration tools, including virtual meeting spaces;
- Access situational updates, suspicious activity reporting, and sector incident reporting.

**HSIN Law Enforcement (HSIN-LE):** Provides situational awareness, BOLOs and RFIs, real-time collaboration rooms, and officer safety and resource alerts and libraries. Through HSIN-LE members can:

- Create, distribute, and gain 24/7 situational awareness;
- Collaborate and communicate on local, regional, and national incidents and threats

## ATTEND OSLE WEBINARS

To help share timely information and resources on relevant homeland security topics with our law enforcement partners, the DHS Office for State and Local Law Enforcement (OSLLE) has established a monthly webinar series. These webinars provide a forum for discussion and include briefings from DHS and other partners, to include briefings by SLTTC law enforcement agencies to ensure that the non-federal perspective is also being incorporated into these discussions.
