DHS Official Reception and Representation Expenses Third Quarter, FY 2024

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I. Legislative Language

This report was prepared pursuant to direction in the Joint Explanatory Statement, accompanying the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Appropriations Act (P.L. 118-47).

The joint explanatory statement in the Congressional Record (March 22, 2024, page H1807) includes the following:

Official Reception and Representation Expenses: DHS shall continue to submit quarterly obligation reports for official reception and representation expenses, as in prior years. Prior to the obligation of any funds for reception and representation expenses to purchase collectibles or memorabilia, the Department shall provide the Committees no less than 14 days advance written notification describing the purpose of such purchases and the projected costs.

This report is cumulative through the third quarter of FY 2024, ending June 30, 2024.

II. Background

A. Terminology

Official Reception: An occasion for which the primary purpose is to explain or to interpret the programs of DHS. Events may be held in the United States or in foreign countries and may be attended by domestic or foreign officials or others being entertained for official purposes.

Representation: Entertainment primarily of foreign dignitaries in a foreign country in connection with the interests of DHS. Representation also may include official entertainment of domestic or foreign officials within or outside the borders of the United States, where the principal purpose of the event is related to a responsibility or a concern of DHS.

B. Official Reception and Representation (ORR) Funds

DHS uses appropriated funds for ORR purposes, as defined in Section IIA of this report. ORR funds are expended only to extend official courtesies to guests to maintain the standing and prestige of the United States and DHS. ORR funds may be used to fund official activities that further DHS interests or to extend official courtesies for other distinguished and prominent citizens who made a substantial contribution to the United States or to DHS. ORR funds are used for expenses incurred in connection with official agency events, typically characterized by a mixed ceremonial, social, and/or business purpose, and hosted in a formal sense by high-level agency officials. ORR funds are not used to pay for meals or refreshments for U.S. Government employees in connection with routine interagency or intra-agency working meetings.

DHS extends official courtesies to federal, state, and local dignitaries and officials such as the President and Vice President of the United States, Cabinet members, members of Congress and their professional staff, governors, mayors, citizen committees, and other distinguished or prominent citizens who made a substantial contribution to the Nation or the Department. Courtesies extended include the cost of luncheons, dinners, receptions, mementos, and participation expenses at DHS-sponsored events.
