Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Annual Report on the Use of No-Knock Entries by DHS Law Enforcement Agencies – Fiscal Year 2024

In accordance with Section 10(c) of Executive Order (EO) 14074, this report details the use of no-knock entries conducted by DHS law enforcement agencies. The data is broken out, pursuant to the EO, by the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to judicial authorization; the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to exigent circumstances; and disaggregated data by circumstances for no-knock entries in which a law enforcement officer or other person was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.

The table below sets forth the number of instances where DHS law enforcement personnel executed a court-authorized no-knock entry and the number of instances where DHS law enforcement personnel executed a no-knock entry pursuant to exigent circumstances. This data covers the period of Fiscal Year 2024 (October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024). Over the covered time period, there have been no circumstances in which a law enforcement officer or other person was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.
