System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) established the System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders (SAVER) Program to assist emergency responders making procurement decisions.

Located within the Science and Technology
Directorate (S&T) of DHS, the SAVER Program
conducts objective assessments and validations on
commercial equipment and systems, and provides
those results along with other relevant equipment
information to the emergency response community
in an operationally useful form. SAVER provides
information on equipment that falls within the
categories listed in the DHS Authorized Equipment
List (AEL). The SAVER Program mission includes:

- Conducting impartial, practitionerrelevant, operationally oriented assessments and validations of emergency responder equipment;
- Providing information that enables decision makers and responders to better select, procure, use, and maintain emergency responder equipment.

Information provided by the SAVER Program will be shared nationally with the responder community, providing a life- and cost-saving asset to DHS, as well as to federal, state, and local responders.

The SAVER Program is supported by a network of technical agents who perform assessment and validation activities. Further, SAVER focuses primarily on two main questions for the emergency responder community: "What equipment is available?" and "How does it perform?"

Handheld Language Translators

Many Emergency Medical Services and law enforcement agencies rely on interpreters or responders that are multilingual to communicate with non-English speaking individuals. However, a victim may experience delays in receiving time-critical aid while waiting for an interpreter to reach the scene. Hand-held language translation devices offer responders an accelerated method to convey information, translate commands, and gather on-site data.

As a SAVER Technical Agent, the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center (SPAWARSYSCEN), Charleston, has conducted a comparative assessment of speech-to-speech hand-held language translators to provide emergency responders with information on currently available technologies. In preparation for the assessment, SPAWARSYSCEN conducted a focus group to obtain assessment criteria recommendations. Results can be found in the *Hand-held Language Translators Focus Group Report*. The *Hand-held Language Translators Market Survey Report* identifies five commercial-off-the shelf products for evaluation in the assessment.
